- High quality teaching that is differentiated and personalised.
- High expectations of every pupil.
- Ambitious targets based on appropriate assessment and dialogue with pupils and parents.
- Potential areas of difficulty addressed and potential barriers to learning removed through the effective deployment of resources.
- Regular assessment, monitoring and review of children and young people's development and progress against targets and outcomes.

What will every classroom have for MFL?

- Knowledge Organisers that support the learning of Key Vocabulary and Knowledge.
 - Clear displays which support the current learning, including Key Vocabulary.
 - A well-organised classroom with labelled resources.

What will the teaching staff do in order to support the universal offer in MFL?

- Understanding is checked by asking pupils what they have to do.
- Explicit modelling of expectations. An example would be modelled using key vocabulary.
- Instructions are given in small chunks with visual cues and dual coding.
- Make reference to previously taught vocabulary.
