Homework at Lanercost

Homework at Lanercost supports our curriculum vision of children having a life-long love of learning. We aim to ensure that the children have the highest quality learning journey and experience, and this includes homework.

Our Christian Vision and Values underpin our aspirational teaching aims throughout the school. Built upon the National Curriculum, we have crafted a brave, broad and rich curriculum that embodies our values. Within this curriculum, we value learning at home and consolidating learning from the school day.

Whole School Expectations

- Reading or Shared Reading most nights for at least 10 minutes from Early Years, working towards 20 minutes in Year 6. It is not always necessary to read to an adult in upper Key Stage 2 (Y5 and Y6); however, we would always encourage parents and carers to share in the stories their children are reading.
- A subject-based task that usually links to the learning that has been taking place in school. These are either given in a book or sheet or can be on Showbie. Occasionally, for Nursery, an age-appropriate task may be given to enjoy at home with their families.

As a school, we ask parents and carers to sign the Reading Diary once they read with their child daily. We expect that parents and carers read with their child (or know their child has read - KS2) a minimum of four times a week.

Year 1 - Year 6 Expectations

In addition to reading and their subject-specific task, children are expected to complete a page in their English CGP book, which is sent home. This will be marked each week by the teaching staff. Children also have the option to go on Doodle Maths, Doodle Spell, and Numbots (Year 1) Years 2 - 6 also have access to Times Table Rockstars.

Homework Timings

Homework is set on a Friday and collected in on a Tuesday. The teacher will recognise homework weekly with either a 'tick' or a sticker.

Using Apps

If you are struggling to use an app at home or are having difficulty logging in, please speak to the class teacher in the first instance. Passwords for our apps can be found in the front of the children's reading record.
